DISASTROUS WEATHER EVENTS OF 2007

The most striking disastrous weather events of 2007 were the following:

- 1. Cold wave conditions prevailed over northern parts of the country and claimed 63 human lives.
- 2. Heat wave swept major portion of Central and North India and a few pockets in peninsular India and claimed 419 human lives, from witch 169 were from Andhra Pradesh only.
- 3 During summer monsoon of 2007, floods and heavy rains have claimed 1287 human lives apart from loss of large number of live stock and extensive damage to public/private property.

The summary of these natural hazards is based on various reports of the India Meteorological Department and press information. The areas affected by the adverse weather conditions are depicted season wise on four maps.

During 2007, one supercyclonic storm, 'GONU' and a cyclonic storm 'Yengin' formed over the Arabian Sea. One cyclonic storm 'Akash' and one very severe cyclonic Storm 'SIDR' formed over the Bay of Bengal. No system crossed the Indian coast. Details of the same are outlined below:
