

DISASTROUS WEATHER EVENTS OF 2008

The most striking disastrous weather events of 2008 were the following:

- 1. Cold wave conditions prevailed over northern parts of the country and claimed 114 human lives.
- 2. Heat wave swept major portion of Orissa and a few pockets in Andhra Pradesh and claimed 111 human lives.
- 3. During summer monsoon of 2008, floods and heavy rains have claimed 1800 human lives apart from loss of large number of live stock and extensive damage to public/private property.
- 4. Cyclonic Storm RASHMI during 25-27 October 2008 crossed Bangladesh coast near Long.89.5°E as cyclonic storm between 2200-2300 UTC and weakened into low pressure area over Meghalaya on 27th evening and caused loss of 13 human lives in India and also caused extensive damage to public / private property in Meghalaya and Arunachal Pradesh.
- 5. Cyclonic Storm KHAIMUKH during 13-16 November 2008 crossed south Andhra coast close to north of Kavali as a deep depression between 2200-2300 UTC of 15th November, caused extensive damage to crops, fisheries and public property.
- 6. Cyclonic Storm NISHA during 25-27 November 2008 crossed Tamil Nadu coast north of Karaikal between 0000-0100 UTC near Lat. 11.3^oN and 79.8^oE and weakened into deep depression at 0900 UTC of 27th November and caused loss of 100 human lives and also caused extensive damage to paddy crops in 55,250 hectares.

The summary of these natural hazards is based on various reports of the India Meteorological Department and press information. The areas affected by the adverse weather conditions are depicted season wise on four maps.
