DISASTROUS WEATHER EVENTS OF 2009

The most striking disastrous weather events of 2009 were the following:

- 1. Cold wave conditions prevailed over northern parts of the country and claimed 79 human lives.
- 2. Heat wave swept major portion of Northern and Central parts of India and claimed 216 human lives.
- 3. During summer monsoon of 2009, floods and heavy rains claimed 1206 human lives apart from loss of large number of live stocks and extensive damage to public/private property.
- 4. The Cyclonic Storm `AILA' formed during 23-26 May 2009 over the Bay of Bengal (West Central) crossed Indian coast close to Sagar Islands as severe cyclonic storm at 1200 UTC of 25th and caused loss of 100 human lives in West Bengal and also caused extensive damage to crops and public property.
- 5. The Cyclonic Storm 'PHYAN' formed during 9-12 November 2009 over the Arabian Sea (300 kms southwest of Goa) crossed Maharashtra coast between Alibag and Mumbai and caused loss of 15 human lives and also caused extensive damage to crops and public property.

The summary of these natural hazards is based on various reports of the India Meteorological Department and press information. The areas affected by the adverse weather conditions are depicted season wise on four maps.
