## **DISASTROUS WEATHER EVENTS OF 2014**

The most striking disastrous weather events of 2014 were the following:

- Heat wave conditions prevailed over Northeastern, Central and Peninsular parts of the country and claimed human lives over 500 out of which 450 lives claimed from Andhra Pradesh and Telangana alone.
- During summer monsoon floods and heavy rains claimed about 940 human lives including a massive landslide on 5<sup>th</sup> August (due to heavy rains) completely buried a village, 'Malin' (District Pune, Maharashtra). Around 200 people lost their lives in the landslide and also the most devastating event of the year was the floods in Jammu & Kashmir during the second week of September which claimed over 200 lives and left more than 4 lakh people stranded for many days besides causing widespread damage to the agriculture and public/private property.
- A Very Severe Cyclonic Storm (Hud Hud) formed during 7-14 October, over north Andaman Sea near Lat. 11.5<sup>0</sup>N/ Long. 95.0<sup>0</sup>E at 0300 UTC of 7<sup>th</sup> October, crossed north Andhra Pradesh coast over Visakhapatnam on 12<sup>th</sup> October and dissipated over east Uttar Pradesh on 14<sup>th</sup> October. It took a toll of 46 in Andhra Pradesh.

The summary of these natural hazards is based on various reports of the India Meteorological Department and press information. The areas affected by the adverse weather conditions are depicted season wise on four maps.

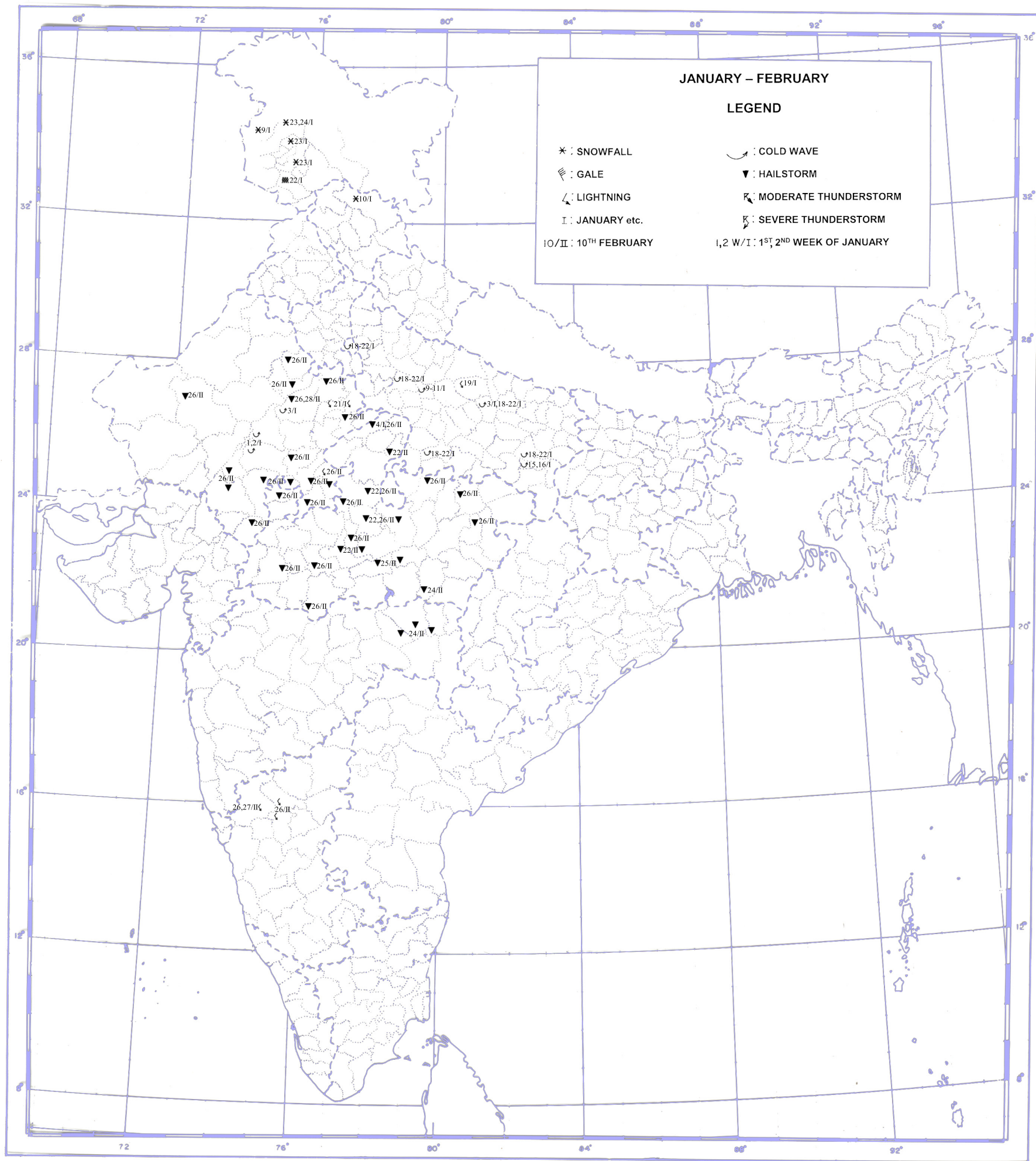

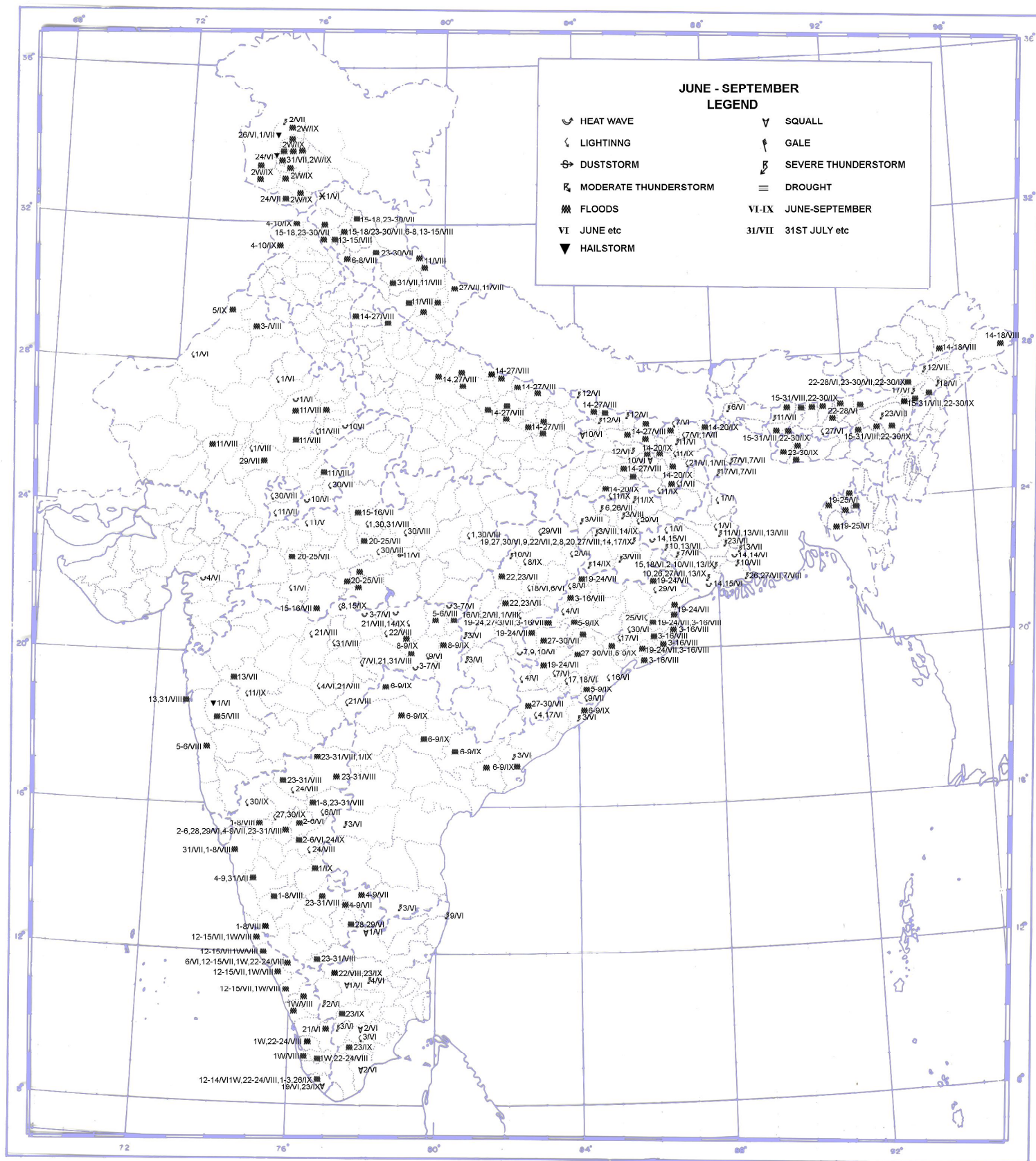

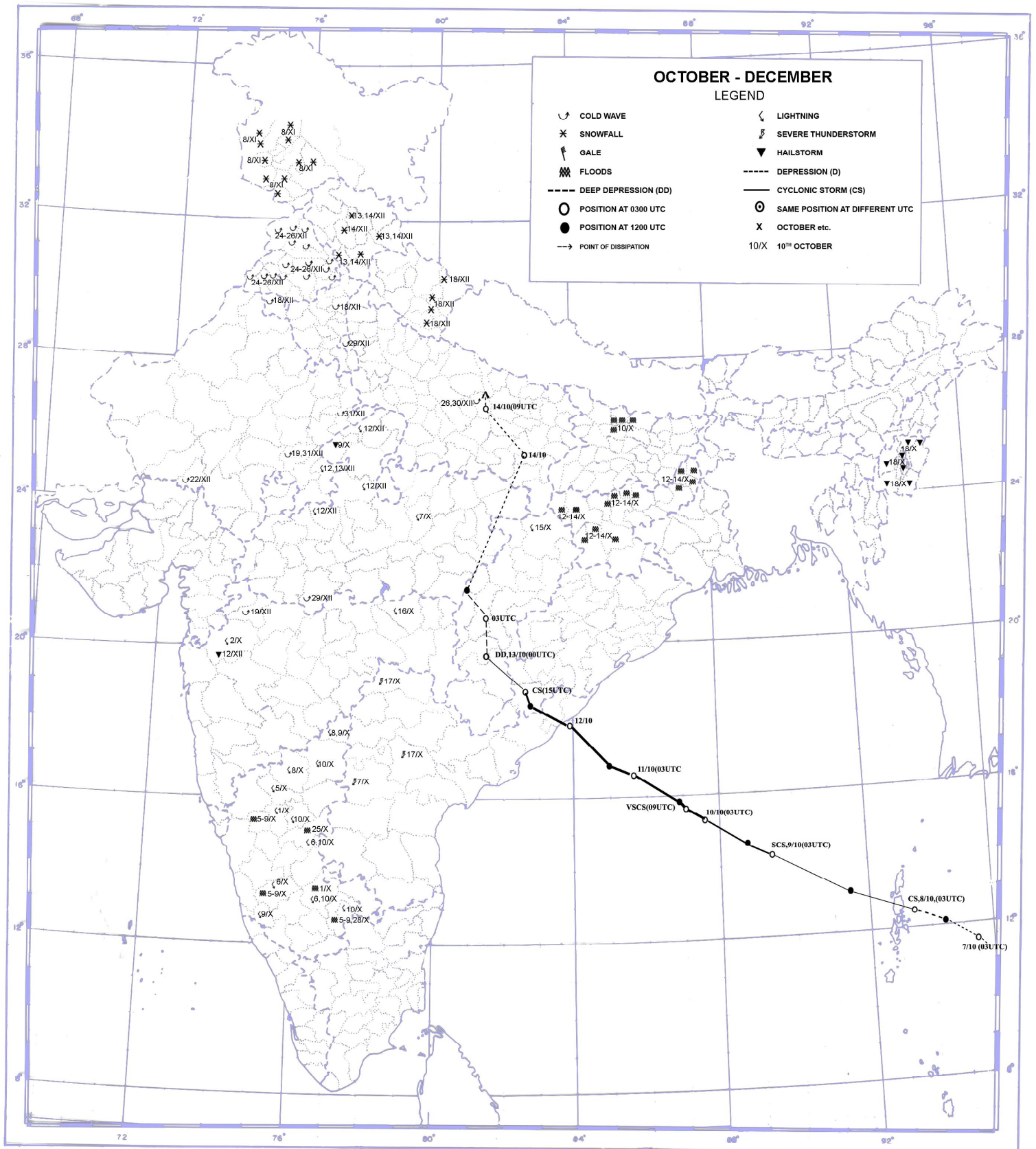
