

DISASTROUS WEATHER EVENTS OF 1988

The most striking disastrous weather events in 1988 were the following :-

- (i) A severe cyclonic storm with a core of hurricane wind, in the Bay of Bengal during 23rd to 30th November, took a toll of 532 human lives and 57,604 cattleheads in West Bengal.
- (ii) Severe flood condition prevailed over large areas of Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Gujarat, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Punjab, Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal and took a toll of over 1400 human lives.
- (iii) Severe heat wave condition prevailed over Madhya Pradesh and Rajasthan during May and June. It took about 500 lives in these states.
- (iv) Heavy snowfall over Jammu and Kashmir during March claimed more than 200 lives.

The summary of these natural hazards is based on the various reports of the India Meteorological Department and the press information. The figures of estimated losses is as per the press reports. The areas affected by the adverse weather phenomenon are depicted, seasonwise on four maps.
