DISASTROUS WEATHER EVENTS OF 2000

The most striking disastrous weather events of 2000 were the following:

- i) Severe floods and heavy rains occurred over many parts of the country and claimed around 2526 human lives. Property worth Rs. 1892 crores damaged and crops in 4.57 lakh hectares lost.
- ii) Severe cold wave conditions prevailed over Bihar and Uttar Pradesh during first week of January, which took a toll of 154 lives from Bihar and 152 lives from Uttar Pradesh.

The summary of these natural hazards is based on the various reports of the India Meteorological Department and press information. The figures for estimated losses are as per the press reports. The areas affected by the adverse weather phenomena are depicted on four maps.
