DISASTROUS WEATHER EVENTS OF 2003

The most striking disastrous weather events of 2003 were the following:

- (i) Severe cold wave spell swept most parts of north India during January and claimed more than 900 human lives.
- (ii) Unprecedented heat wave spell prevailed over Andhra Pradesh during 2nd fortnight of May and 1st fortnight of June and took a toll of more than 1300 human lives.
- (iii) Floods and heavy rains occurred over most parts of the country during southwest monsoon season and claimed more than 1400 human lives apart from loss of livestock. Extensive damage to public and private property also reported.

The summary of these natural hazards is based on press information and various reports of the India Meteorological Department. The areas affected by the adverse weather conditions are depicted seasonwise on four maps.
